

Standard Deviation Notice for Certification to GS-1 Sanitary Paper Standard

December 1, 2023

Background

Green Seal currently references the TAPPI method for T 576: Tensile properties of towel and tissue products (using constant rate of elongation apparatus) in our GS-1 Standard for Sanitary Paper as the only available test method for criterion 2.1.2.2. The T 576 test method has been withdrawn and replaced with T 581: Dry tensile properties of paper towel and tissue products (using constant rate of elongation apparatus). As the two methods are not interchangeable, removing the reference to T 576 and replacing it with a reference to T 581 is a substantive change that would require a formal standard revision in accordance with [Green Seal's Standard Development Manual](#).

Green Seal is [currently revising](#) our GS-1 Standard for Sanitary Paper. We plan to update all references to the T 576 method in the standard to T 581 as part of this revision. The anticipated timeline for this criteria revision is mid-to-late 2024.

Deviation Requirements

A product can receive certification to the GS-1 Standard for Sanitary Paper as of the date of this notice if they demonstrate they meet the criterion of 2.1.2.2. using the T 581 test method. In the criteria where T 576 is referenced as one optional test method, Green Seal will accept T 576 results, but encourage products to utilize one of the other available methods until the standard is updated.
